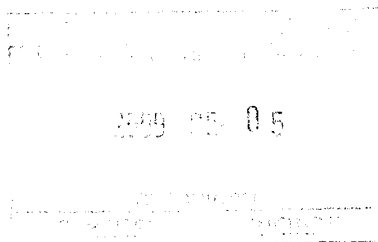

**ADMISSION TO SOUTH AFRICA: DELEGATES TO THE 68<sup>TH</sup> PLENARY MEETING OF  
THE INTERNATIONAL COTTON ADVISORY COMMITTEE (ICAC): CAPE TOWN: 7 – 11  
SEPTEMBER 2009**

In reply to your undated letter, I wish to inform you that the South African Missions abroad have been authorized to issue visas to delegates attending the above event, provided a letter of invitation is submitted and that they are not prohibited or undesirable in terms of the Immigration Act, 2002, as amended.

To gain admission to South Africa, it is necessary to be in possession of visas obtainable from South African Missions abroad, if the persons concerned are citizens of countries subject to visa control. All delegates' passports must be valid for at least 30 days beyond

the intended date of departure from the RSA and should contain at least one unused visa page when presenting the passport for purposes of endorsing a visa or a permit.

Immunisation for yellow fever is an entry requirement if the journey starts or entails passing through the yellow fever belt of Africa or South America. Please refer to the attached list, as compiled by the World Health Organisation, listing the countries that fall within the belt.

Please note that if applicants are in countries where South Africa is not presented, they need to submit their documentation to the nearest South African Mission abroad.
