Dr Megha N. Parajulee

Dr Parajulee is Professor, Faculty Fellow, and Regents Fellow at Texas A&M University Research Center, in Lubbock, Texas, USA. A native of Nepal, he earned a BSc (Agri Econ) in 1987 from Himachal Pradesh, India, and his MS (1991) and PhD (1994) in Entomology from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, USA. Dr Parajulee joined Texas A&M University in 1994 as a cotton entomologist and is serving as the Cotton Entomology Program Leader since 2001. He is a leader in cotton entomology and cropping systems research, teaching, and service, with 130 refereed and more than 330 non-refereed publications; 165 invited and 350 submitted presentations; and 35 MS/PhD students mentored during his 29-year tenure at Texas A&M University. He has been active internationally with plenary/keynote speaking roles in more than 20 countries and served as a Fulbright Senior Scholar in Nepal and Uzbekistan. Dr Parajulee received the Texas A&M Vice Chancellor's Award in Research Excellence, Faculty Fellow Award, Regents Fellow Award, Entomological Society of America Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Excellence Award, and US Department of Agriculture Southern Region IPM Hall of Fame Award.
